Main Activities:



• In this workshop we will focus on all main activities, from hardware selection (we'll choose the STM32H7B3I-DK) through UI Development.



We'll work from a prepared CubeMX project and do the TouchGFX AL Development necessary to run a TouchGFX application on an STM32H7B3I-DK

Comes with complete LTDC Pin configuration, OCTOSPI, Clock tree, etc to run TouchGFX.

Our focus will be to configure the TouchGFX Generator for AL development.



# **Tool chain**



#### Tools

At this point you've already installed and verified the following tools:

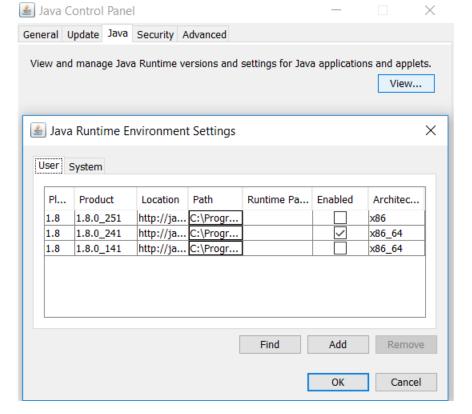
- 64-bit Java to support CubeMX. Latest version is v251, but older versions work.
- CubeMX 5.6.1 to configure the MCU + Cube FW H7 pack v1.7.0
- TouchGFX Generator v4.13.0 to generate and configure the TouchGFX AL
- CubeIDE v1.3.0 for your IDE and target compiler (arm-gcc)
- STM32CubeProgrammer v2.4.0 to program the STM32H7B3I-DK



#### Tools

Verify your installation by attempting to generate a CubeIDE project from within CubeMX. If no "STM32CubeIDE" folder is created, check your java

version with "Configure java".







#### Generally, two workflows exist:

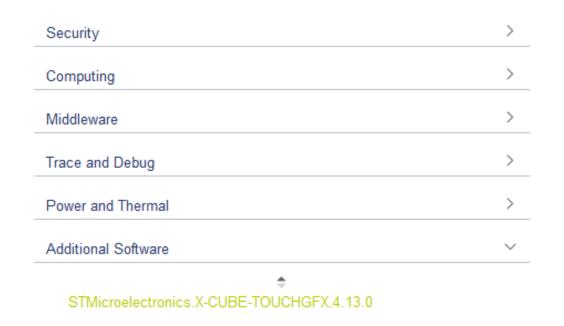
- 1. Start from CubeMX/CubeIDE (Custom hardware)
- 2. Start from TouchGFX Designer (STM32 Development Kits)

We'll be using a pre-configured project.



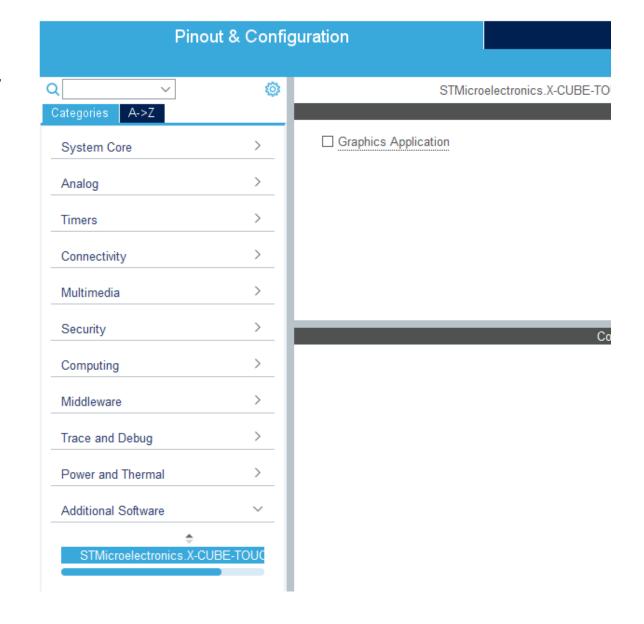

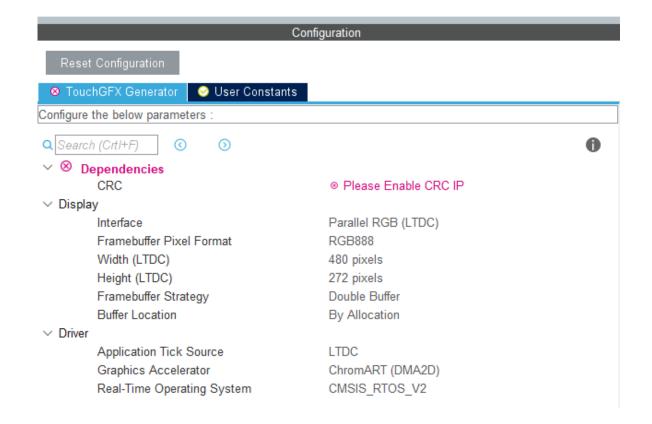
WF-2: Enable TouchGFX Generator by selecting "Graphics Application".

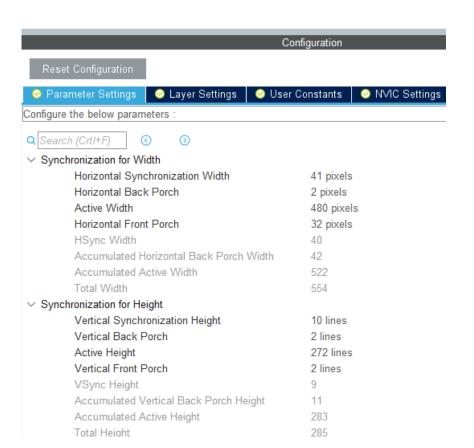

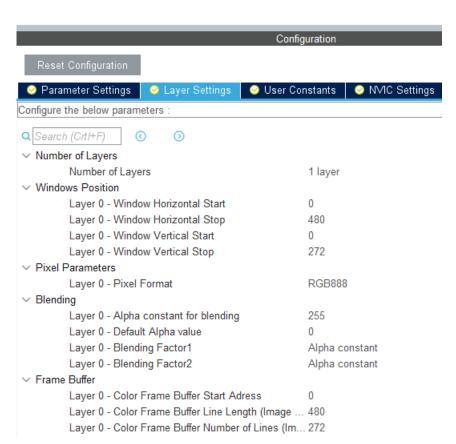

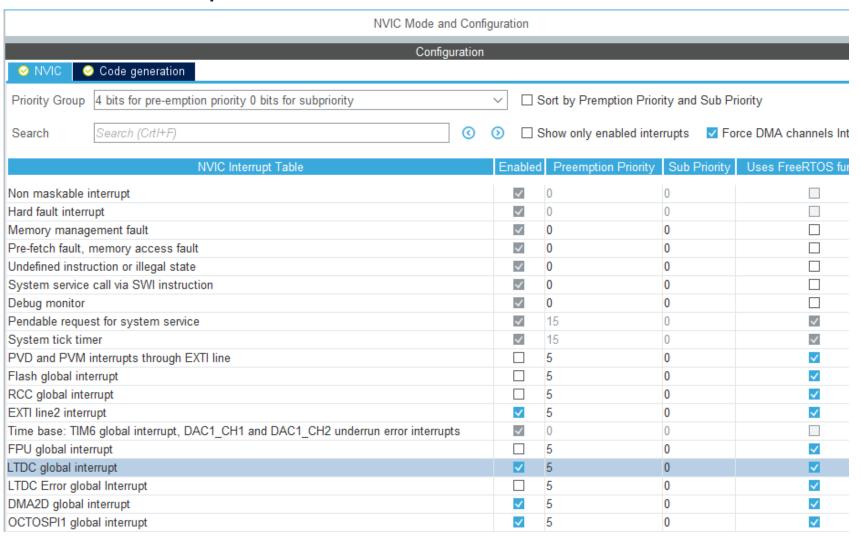

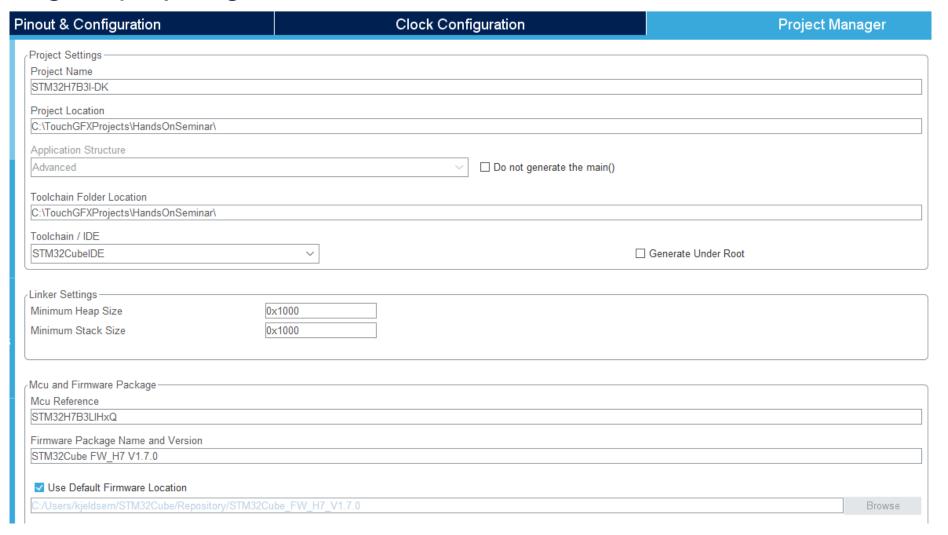

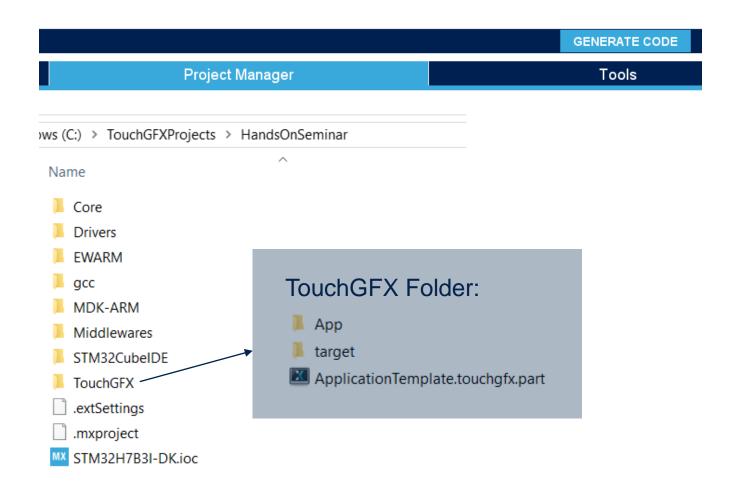

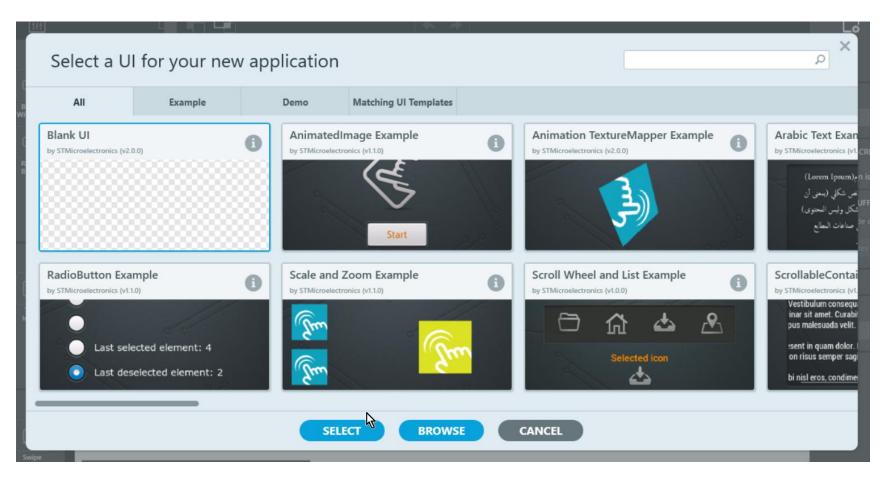

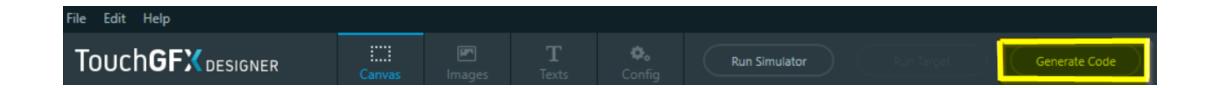

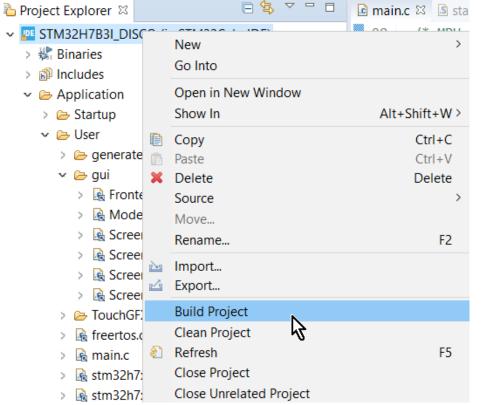

Press "Generate code".





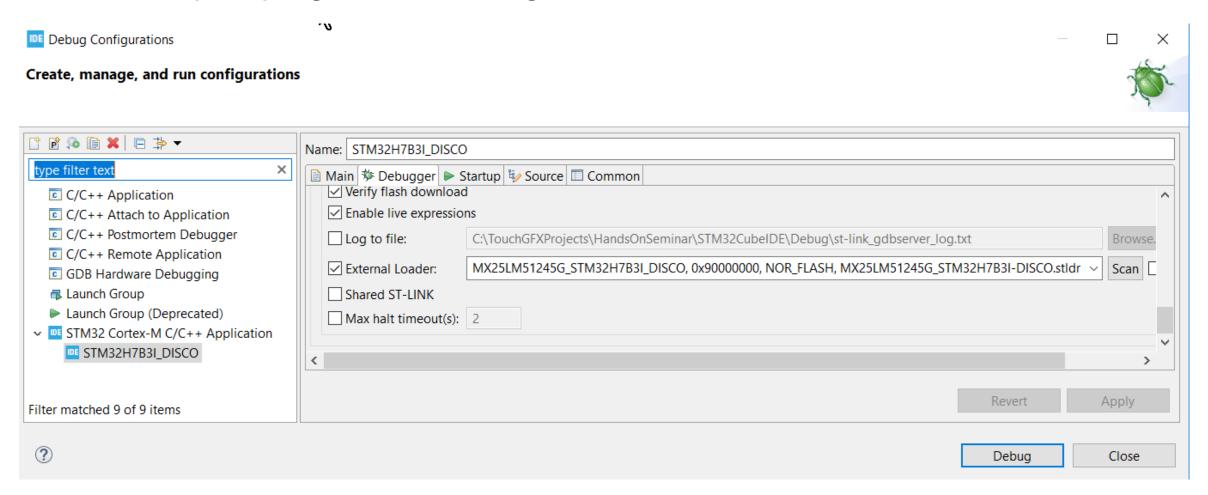
